

In this book, the younger ones will meet no less than 9 animal species: Siberian bears, Brazilian tamarins, Ethiopian servals, Greenland seals, Nicaraguan caimans, French swallows... Each one of them has a good reason to ask the reader for a big hug before going to sleep: the need to be congratulated, supported, comforted, thanked, calmed... one of them doesn't want to be hugged at all, and yes, you should only hug someone who wants to! From 10 to 1, every page readers turn, they will meet a new animal, discover a new world, give a stroke with their fingers or the palm of their hand... until ultimately discovering the face of a baby peacefully asleep.




Only the cat is perfect, curled up in a deep sleep, and the reader is invited to shake the book in order to wake it up!

Here, readers will discover that the blue whale weighs just as much as forty elephants, that the bowhead whale's baleens are as tall as two grown-up humans, and also that the mother dolphin brings its newborn babies to the surface so that they have their first breath before suckling them, or that sperm whales can stay up to two hours underwater without breathing...






A FLOCK OF SHEEP

Obstinacy of buffaloes, flamboyance of flamingos, army of caterpillars, smack of jellyfish... language is richer than you would think to describe animals groups! Jean Da Ros proves it here by displaying their often surprising and rarely used official names. The poetry and humour arising from these unknown designations isn't the only surprise in this book. Indeed, to represent each group of animals, the author has put together coloured beads and photographed them from above. The compositions reproduce with a great impression of movement the stylized figures of the bees and the elephants, the giraffes and the parrots... For the enjoyment of children and adults alike!

IN THE SHADE

Adrien Parlange

Under a burning sun, in the middle of the desert, the shade is rare. Only a small rock provides coolness. A child comes up and lays there, shielded from the sun. A snake joins her, followed by a fox, a hare, a hedgehog, a wild boar, a little goat and, lastly, a flock of birds. As the hours go by, the shade moves like a clock and the group gets larger: each character must find its place, a comfortable position in this tiny oasis of coolness. The reader dreads the arrival of each newcomer: will the snake bite the child, and the fox eat the hare? But when the sun finally sets, it's a joyful and united crew that comes out of the shadow...

THE RABBIT AND THE SNAKE

Jean-Marc Fiess

Snake wants Rabbit to race with him. But Rabbit is wary: he knows that this friendship is contrary to nature and that this game could actually be an excuse to hunt him. Snake insists and uses charming arguments to convince Rabbit. All along the 6 animated spreads of this tale, Rabbit resists and stands his ground, ultimately managing to escape Snake's pressure and to return to the safety of his hole. Built as a conversation between the two, this book ingeniously addresses consent, using a clear vocabulary and striking key sentences that readers might recognize if one day confronted with someone who tries to force them: "It will be our secret", "It's for your own good"... to which the prey counters with an unequivocal "no": "no one can force me if I don't want to".



- The simple and clever systems created by Jean-Marc Fiess to animate this tale stage the two characters in a refined setting, focusing the reader's attention on the balance of power.
- The choice of the typically sweet rabbit and the deceitful snake strongly highlights the obvious imbalance in the relationship.



But beyond the island, the winning marbles, the lollipops traded in the schoolyard, the cherry on top of an ice cream sundae are memories that belong to a universal childhood that lives in each and every one of us.

During winter, Yuri's father hunts, not animals, but ice: giant ice cubes from the lake that people use to drink, wash, and cook until summer... indeed, it's so cold the taps are frozen! Yuri's story alternates with non-fiction pages that describe the regional wildlife and plant life: trees, birds, fish...



The duckling doesn't know the first thing about ducks or bats, but one thing he does have is a loving parent standing above him as he learns how to smooth his feathers and to swim in the water.

Anne-Sophie Plat & Giulia Gallino



Its old inhabitant, who had been living there for years, just passed away. From then on, so many different characters come to visit: the children and grandchildren, who have their childhood memories there and clean up the house in the Spring; the old neighbour, who always makes sure the house is fine when nobody is there; and a young hiker who finds shelter under its roof for a few days. Displaying still frames like a recurring theatre décor that evolves through the seasons of life, this endearing home shares its own story, made of all the people it welcomed and the bonds that were made within its walls.

EVENING FEARS


Laurie Agusti

At bedtime, turning off the lamps that light up the familiar objects of the bedroom can be guite an adventure. The child narrating this story is rather brave: he mentally draws an emergency evacuation plan and leaves the door ajar so that a reassuring ray of light crosses it. But it turns out this feeble light is just what plays with the darkness of the room to change it into a scary theatre! In the child's imagination, the tinsels and lamps become immense spider webs; the shadows transform into the fur of a gigantic monster; even worse, the bedroom turns into a classroom! Fortunately, the child finally reassures himself and falls asleep... leaving way for a gang of nice night monsters to party joyfully!






THE BLIND MIRROR

Giacomo Nanni

The hero of this book is a blind mirror; you couldn't make it up! To be exact, it's almost blind: everything is blurry to it. And if it can't see the people looking at it, it means they can't see themselves either. Has it become useless? It prefers to think about the past and all the wonderful things and animals it saw when it was still working and travelling with its old owner: the tall African giraffes, the penguins in the Antarctic that it calls "black and white lions", the old gramophone that hosted famous triplet singers... In this fanciful story, the line between real memories and confused recollections is blurry and creates humorous situations. At the end, the reader discovers with relief that the mirror isn't blind at all: it just needed a good wipe!

Our relation to our senses varies depending on the groups we belong to. Our body movements, clothes, food, music, words differ from one culture or one time to another. For instance. tea is liked everywhere, but there are as many rituals to enjoy it as there are people on Earth! Over almost 100 pages, this book goes beyond the scientific aspect of the five senses to offer a social approach through concrete examples and thoughts.






CARNIVALS

This profuse non-fiction book takes the reader into the time of collective madness which is the carnival. This lively, vibrant party, which takes place around the world and generally coincides with the end of Winter, has many faces: traditional in Binche, spectacular in Rio de Janeiro, dancing in Cayenne... From Europe to America via the Caribbean, this book tells us about 10 carnivals still existing today. For each of them are presented 2 emblematic characters as well as the many details and specificities of these joyful events. Through the history of these masked parties, the book also adresses the history of colonization and the cultures that stemmed from it.



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
